Consideration and action pertaining to the Marley Park Community Facilities District Board's intent to levy secondary property taxes at a rate of \$3.4771 per one hundred dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation on June 21, 2022; Resolution MPCFD # 2022-02.

Motion:

I move to approve Resolution MPCFD #2022-02.

Background:

This item provides notice of the District Board's intent to adopt and set the property tax levy for the Marley Park Community Facilities District on June 21, 2022. This agenda item satisfies Arizona Revised Statute (A.R.S.) 48-723 which states that all statutes relating to the levy and collection of general county taxes, including the collection of delinquent taxes and sale of property for nonpayment of taxes apply to community facilities districts. Per A.R.S. 42-17104 the District Board is required to hold a public hearing on proposed expenditures and tax levy (the final budget) in which any taxpayer may appear and be heard in favor of or against any proposed expenditure or tax levy. A.R.S. 42-17253 requires that the tax rates be adopted. Community Facilities District budgets are required to be adopted at least fourteen days prior to the adoption of the property tax levy. This item is the notice of intent to levy taxes, which will occur on June 21, 2022.

Objective Analysis:

This public hearing will serve to fulfill the requirements of state statute with respect to proposed expenditures and property tax levies. The secondary property tax levy is programmed to support debt service payments associated with the bond issuance for Marley Park.

Policy Compliant:

This item is compliant with A.R.S. 48-723, A.R.S. 42-17253, and A.R.S. 42-17104.

Financial Impact:

There is no direct financial impact from the public hearing; however, this public hearing continues the process which will establish the amount of property tax collections for Marley Park Community Facilities District for the upcoming fiscal year. There is no direct financial impact from the Intent to Levy secondary property tax levy of \$2,073,600 and a rate of \$3.4771 per one hundred dollars (\$100) of assessed value for adoption on June 21, 2022.

Budget Impact:

There is no direct budget impact for the public hearing and the intent to levy property taxes; however, this public hearing continues the process which will result in the adoption of the final budget for the upcoming fiscal year. The secondary property tax levies are included as a part of the FY2023 final Marley Park Community Facilities District budget which is scheduled for adoption in this meeting later this evening.

FTE Impact:

No full-time equivalent impact will occur with this item.

MARLEY PARK COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT

A RESOLUTION OF THE DISTRICT BOARD OF THE MARLEY PARK COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT, A COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT OF ARIZONA, NOTICING THE INTENTION TO LEVY SECONDARY TAXES OF \$3.4771 PER EACH ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100) OF ASSESSED VALUATION; AND SETTING THE PROPOSED PROPERTY TAX LEVY ADOPTION FOR JUNE 21, 2022.

WHEREAS, Arizona Revised Statutes § 48-723 states that all statutes relating to the levy and collection of general county taxes, including the collection of delinquent taxes and sale of property for nonpayment of taxes, apply to community facilities districts;

WHEREAS, the District Board of Marley Park Community Facilities District is required by Arizona Revised Statutes § 42-17253 to adopt an annual tax levy based upon the rate to be assessed per each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation of property within the District;

WHEREAS, the secondary tax levy for Fiscal Year 2023 beginning July 1, 2022, must be adopted prior to the third Monday in August, and not less than fourteen days after adoption of the Community Facilities District budget; and

WHEREAS, the Marley Park Community Facilities District budget will be adopted after a public hearing at a meeting of the District Board held on June 7, 2022, at least fourteen days prior to the date of the adoption of the property tax levy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD OF THE MARLEY PARK COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Notice is given of the District's intent to levy secondary property tax in the amount of \$3.4771 per each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation; and setting the consideration of a motion to levy the proposed secondary property taxes for the Marley Park Community Facilities District on June 21, 2022.

Motion:

I move to approve Resolution MPCFD #2022-03.

Background:

On May 3, 2022 the District Board adopted Resolution MPCFD #2022-01 adopting a tentative budget for FY2023 and authorizing publication of said budget. Following the actions on May 3rd, the adopted tentative budget was published on May 24, 2022 and May 31, 2022, in the local paper. The mandatory ten days have passed, meeting all requirements for final budget adoption. This resolution adopts the final budget for fiscal year 2023. The authorization to levy property tax will be voted upon on June 21, 2022.

Per Arizona Revised Statutes 48-716, the board shall indicate its approval of the budget by resolution, which shall provide for a hearing on the budget as approved.

Objective Analysis:

This is part of the budget adoption process as required by state law. Although a separate entity, the same timelines are followed with respect to the final adoption of the budget for the City.

Policy Compliant:

This resolution is compliant with City and Board Policy.

Financial Impact:

The final budget will allow for the expenditure of up to \$15,713,500 within the district.

Budget Impact:

Adoption of the final fiscal year 2023 budget establishes spending limits and allocates public resources to specific uses within the MPCFD. As presented, this budget is balanced.

FTE Impact:

This resolution does not impact the number of FTEs.

RESOLUTION MPCFD 2022-03

MARLEY PARK COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT

A RESOLUTION OF THE DISTRICT BOARD OF THE MARLEY PARK COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT, A COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT OF ARIZONA, APPROVING A FINAL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023 PURSUANT TO SECTION 48-716, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, AS AMENDED; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE EFFECTIVE AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND APPROVAL ACCORDING TO LAW.

WHEREAS, on February 12, 2004, the Mayor and Council of the City of Surprise, Arizona (the "City"), adopted Resolution 04-51 forming Marley Park Community Facilities District ("MPCFD"), a community facilities district in accordance with Section 48-701 et seq., Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended, as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and expressly made a part hereof;

WHEREAS, MPCFD is a special purpose district for purposes of Article IX, Section 19, Constitution of Arizona, a tax-levying public improvement district for the purposes of Article XIII, Section 7, Constitution of Arizona, and a municipal corporation for all purposes of Title 35, Chapter 3, Articles 3, 3.1., 3.2, 4 and 5, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended, and [except as otherwise provided in Section 48-708(B), Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended] is considered to be a municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State of Arizona, separate and apart from the City;

WHEREAS, a primary purpose for creating MPCFD was to finance certain public infrastructure needed for the development known as "Marley Park" through assessment of ad valorem taxes on all real and personal property within MPCFD; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution MPCFD2020-01, adopted on May 3, 2022 the District Board of MPCFD (a) approved a tentative budget for FY2023, (b) filed required statements and estimates of operation and maintenance expenses of MPCFD, the costs of capital improvements to be financed by the authorized ad valorem tax levy, and the amount of all other expenditures for public infrastructure and enhanced municipal services proposed to be paid from the tax levy and of the amount to be raised to pay general obligation bonds of MPCFD, (c) set a date of June 7, 2022 for a public hearing on the proposed budget and particularly, on the portions of the statements and estimates not relating to debt service on general obligation bonds, and (d) provided for notice of the filing and of the public hearing date.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD OF THE MARLEY PARK COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That certain proposed budget prepared by the MPCFD Treasurer for Fiscal Year 2023, attached hereto and expressly made a part hereof as Exhibit "B", is hereby finally adopted.

Section 2. That if any provision in this Resolution is held invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall not be affected but shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 3. That this Resolution shall be effective after its passage and approval according to law.

Thence North 79 degrees 20 minutes 44 seconds West, a distance of 135.20 feet;

Thence North 18 degrees 20 minutes 48 seconds West, a distance of 65.00 feet;

Thence westerly along said curve, having a radius of 55.00 feet, concave southerly, whose radius bears South 83 degrees 13 minutes 36 seconds West, through a central angle of 135 degrees 40 minutes 15 seconds, a distance of 130.23 feet, to a point of intersection with a non-tangent line;
